For the six-month period from April 1, 2025 to September 30, 2025, revenues were 111,529 million yen (down 17,194 million yen year-on-year), operating profit was 9,240 million yen (down 2,466 million yen year-on-year), and ordinary profit was 8,483 million yen (down 1,621 million yen year-on-year). Profit attributable to owners of the parent was 11,047 million yen (up 1,895 million yen year-on-year).

In the International Shipping business during the six months ended on September 30, 2025, in the dry bulk carrier, demand for transportation of iron ore, grain, and minor bulk cargo remained firm despite continued sluggish domestic demand in the Chinese economy. Ongoing navigational risks in the Red Sea and Suez Canal led to longer voyages via the Cape of Good Hope, tightening vessel supply-demand conditions. Additionally, the advancement of slow steaming in response to various environmental regulations contributed to a reduction in vessel supply.

The market for Capesize bulk carriers (180,000 DWT type) showed a gradual upward trend, supported by strong shipments of bauxite from Africa. For Panamax and smaller-sized vessels (20,000–80,000 DWT type), the drought-related transit restrictions in the Panama Canal were resolved early in the period, easing passage limitations. However, navigational risks in the Red Sea and Suez Canal persisted. Furthermore, China's shift in grain import sources from the United States to South America increased ton-mile demand (transport distance × cargo volume), contributing to continued tight vessel supply-demand conditions.

In the market for VLGCs (Very Large Gas Carriers), transportation demand for LPG remained solid. However, the easing of transit restrictions in the Panama Canal improved vessel turnaround rates, resulting in a flat market trend in the latter half of the period.

Under these circumstances, although the yen appreciated during the period, leading to a decline in revenues and ordinary profit compared to the same period last year, the Group recorded a gain on the sale of aging vessels as part of fleet management policy. This gain was recognized as extraordinary income, enabling the Group to secure an increase in profit attributable to owners of parent.

In the coastal shipping business, with respect to dry bulk cargo, although weather and sea conditions were relatively favorable, demand remained weak in both the construction and manufacturing sectors. As a result, the volume of steel cargo transport remained flat compared to the same period of last year.

On the other hand, while general cargo vessels transporting steel raw materials performed steadily, the production adjustments at domestic steel mills had a negative impact, resulting in a year-on-year decline in transport volume, particularly for limestone carriers.

For electric utility-related cargo, transport volume exceeded the level of the same period last year, supported by increased electricity demand during the summer season. In contrast, cement-related cargo fell below the previous year's level, affected by declining domestic demand and labor shortages at construction sites.

As for liquid cargo, although LNG transport volume increased, LPG transport volume declined due to the redelivery of one chartered vessel for owner-related reasons and a decrease in domestic demand. Under these circumstances, the Group made

efforts to operate vessels efficiently, resulting in year-on-year increases in both revenues and profit in the domestic shipping segment.

Marine transportation services comprise almost the entire business of the Group, with the international shipping business accounting for approximately 90% of consolidated revenues and the coastal shipping business accounting for approximately 10%.

#### (2) Overview of Financial Position

Total assets as of September 30, 2025 amounted to 288,822 million yen, up 874 million yen from the end of the previous fiscal year. Of this amount, current assets increased by 6,857 million yen, mainly due to an increase in cash and deposits. Non-current assets decreased by 5,983 million yen, mainly due to a decrease in vessels.

Total liabilities decreased by 8,206 million yen to 117,004 million yen. Current liabilities increased by 3,009 million yen, mainly due to an increase in short-term borrowings. Non-current liabilities decreased by 11,215 million yen, mainly due to a decrease in long-term borrowings.

Total net assets increased by 9,080 million yen from the end of the previous fiscal year to 171,818 million yen, mainly due to an increase in retained earnings resulting from profit attributable to owners of parent, net of dividends paid.

With respect to the dry bulk market in third quarter onward, global demand for transportation of steel raw materials is expected to remain firm. Continued infrastructure investment in India and Southeast Asian countries is anticipated to support demand.

On the other hand, depending on the future progress of the Chinese economy, a decline in crude steel production in China may exert downward pressure on transportation demand for steel-related cargo. Additionally, uncertainties remain regarding U.S. trade policy, which could potentially impact the maritime shipping market. These risk factors will continue to require close monitoring.

Furthermore, from the fourth quarter onward, seasonal factors such as the onset of the rainy season in South America may lead to shipment delays, resulting in a softening of market conditions. While the current trend remains toward a weaker yen, the narrowing interest rate differential between Japan and the U.S. suggests a shift toward a stronger yen in our foreign exchange assumptions for the second half of the fiscal year.

In light of our first half consolidated operating results and the business environment surrounding us in the second half, we hereby revise our consolidated earnings forecasts for the full fiscal year ending March 2026, which we announced on July 31, 2025, as described above. The Company's assumptions for the exchange rate of the yen against the U.S. dollar is expected to average 145.00 yen for the second half of the fiscal year. The Company also expects average fuel oil prices (all grades) to be \$468 per metric ton in the second half.

The Company has positioned returning of profits to shareholders as one of its important management policies. The Company's basic policy is to maintain sustainable dividend distribution in accordance with the Company's performance

based on a dividend payout ratio of 30% of consolidated business results, while securing internal reserves necessary to achieve stable corporate growth and to respond to changes in the business environment in the future. The Board of Directors today resolved to pay an interim dividend of 105 yen per share for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2026, in line with the previously announced forecast. The year-end dividend forecast is revised from 105 yen per share in the previous announcement to 140 yen per share based on the above revision of the full-year consolidated earnings forecast. As a result, the annual dividend is expected to be 245 yen per share.
